



AED Defibrillator Locations



- An Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) can save a life when someone's heart has stopped (cardiac arrest).
- **Jackton & Thorntonhall Community Council** has provided a public access defibrillator for each village.
- Please take the time to locate the one closest to you in case of an emergency (see maps overleaf). Look for the yellow cabinets.
- AEDs are easy to use, compact, portable and very effective. They are designed to be used by lay persons; the machines guide the operator through the process by verbal instructions and visual prompts. They are safe and will not allow a shock to be given unless the heart's rhythm requires it. They are most effective if combined with CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation).

- ***Remember, you could be the one on whom another person's life may depend. Please learn how to give them the best chance of surviving!***

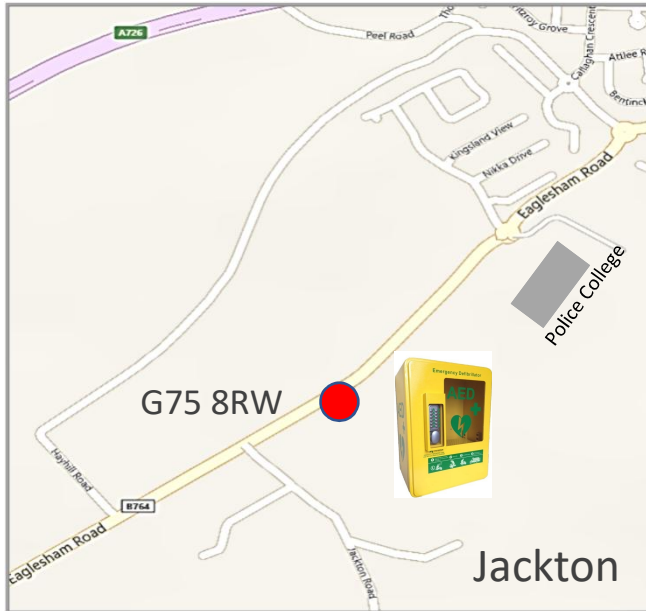

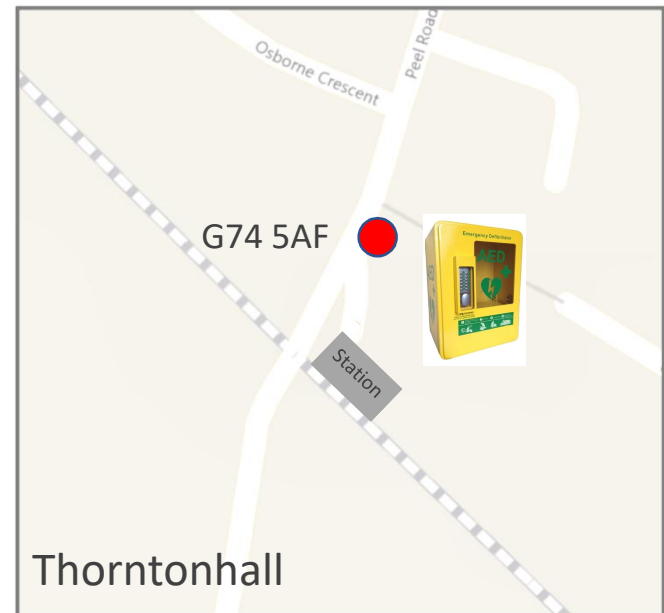
